
























RULES & CONDITIONS

COMPETITION RULES FOR ANGLERS (ROD & REEL FISHING)

- 1. All competitors must pay the entry fee, and as with any recreational fishing, must comply with RMS NSW Maritime and NSW DPI Fisheries licensing & regulatory requirements.
- 2. All forms of recreational angling fishing is permitted from bait to lure or fly. You are permitted to fish from Boats, Kayaks, Land or Beach, basically anywhere is available to fish that has public access.
- 3. The All Tackle Non-Line and Catch & Release categories are open to the public.
- 4. Fishing time to start at 12:01am Friday the 29th of September, to last weigh-in at 12 noon Sunday the 1st October.
- 5. Weigh-ins and recordings will begin at the following times;

Friday 29th September 1pm – 3pm

Saturday 30th September 1pm – 3pm

Sunday 1st October 12 noon - 3pm

You **MUST** be inside the gates before the stated times to have your catch weighed or recorded. Gates will be closed at the commencement of stated weigh-in times. If broken down, or assisting in rescue, please notify club reception on 4471 7327 and special consideration will be given for your circumstance.

- 6. The fishing area extends north to Bendalong Point (35°14′52.00″S) and South to Bermagui (36°26′00.00″S). No limit to the East or West. Please note, the Batemans Bay Marine Park has Sanctuary Zones within the park. It is illegal to fish within these sanctuary zones. Please visit the following website address for further details on sanctuary zones. http://www.dpi.nsw.gov.au/fishing/marine-protected-areas/marine-parks/batemans-marine-parks
- 7. All boats will be required to use launching facilities within the designated boundaries, except where entry bars, seaways are declared dangerous by the SCMB committee in which case the SCMB committee reserves the right to nominate alternative facilities.
- 8. Age categories for entry purposes of Angling are SUB-JUNIOR 0 to 10, JUNIORS 11 to 16 and ADULTS 17 +.
- 9. All fish must be caught by hook, within the competition time and fishing area. Fish to be gutted and gilled, prior to weigh-in. Mutilated fish will be disqualified. ANSA members, gutted and gilled fish will be eligible for All Tackle Length Only trophy length awards and national/state records.
- 10. Only All Tackle Non-Line class listed species for this competition to be weighed-in. A maximum of one fish, per specie, per person, per day can be weighed. (i.e. 1 Snapper, 1 Flathead, 1 Salmon, etc. Can be weighed per day per person.) All fish will be tail docked after weighing to prevent from being weighed the following days. Please identify your catch by other means if fishing in a group.
- 11. Please Note, Grouper is not listed on the All Tackle Non-line species list, and therefore cannot be weighed-in. However, Grouper is listed on the Public Catch & Release Longest Length.
- 12. The Public Catch & Release Longest Length categories will be issued a random code each competition day and posted on the competition's website and Facebook page. Any competitor wanting to compete in the Public Catch & Release Lonest Length must display a piece of paper with their entry number and daily random code printed clearly on the paper. Any fish to be entered for catch & release must by laid flat on a competition grade catch & release mat, for example a NSW Fisheries mat, ANSA mat, Pirtek mat or similar. A digital photo must be taken as proof with the fish alive and the nose of the fish touching the start of the mat. The photo must contain the fish laying flat on the mat with the paper included in the photo. The photo must be clear and in focus. The photo must be presented to recording officials on each day, for example, Friday's code cannot be presented on a Saturday or Sunday. Recording official's measurements are final.
- 13. Any under size fish will disqualify any person's total days catch from weigh-in.
- 14. Sharks weighed are for heaviest shark prize only. Sharks do not count in total catch weight for Clubs or Individual total catch weights.
- 15. All prizes will be calculated after Sunday's weigh-in. The All Tackle Non-Line class total heaviest catch champion prizes are calculated by the heaviest total weight of the three days catch.
- 16. The All Tackle Non-Line class species prizes are awarded to the heaviest individual fish over the three days. There are first, second and third prizes for each specie. If a tie, cash and tangible prizes will be shared.
- 17. The non-affiliated winning club trophy will be awarded to the club with the heaviest total catch of their best four (or less) anglers, divided by four.
- 18. The Champion ANSA club will be awarded as follows. The 5 highest point scoring fish of each section shall be awarded points on a 5-4-3-2-1 basis. The points so awarded for each section are then totalled and the club with the highest aggregate point score declared the champion club.

The ANSA divisions available within the South Coast Mighty Bonanza Fishing Competition are;

- a. Highest Point Score ANSA Bluewater
- b. Highest Point Score Ladies
- c. Highest Point Score Juniors
- d. Length only Snapper
- e. Length only Bream
- f. Largest Length Only (Catch & Release) Flathead.

NSW STATE SPEARFISHING TITLES PAIRS EVENT 2017 OVERVIEW

TOMAKIN BONANZA - USFA "ONE - UP ONE DOWN" PAIRS EVENTS WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW.

The Pairs concept has been going on successfully in New Zealand for many decades now, it was brought in to combat the incidence of mishap to the individual diver and since its inception there has been no major injury to a spearfisher during these team events, this pairs format is also what is used in the Inter Pacific competitions that our Australian team enters against countries such as New Zealand, Noumea, Tahiti and Hawaii.

The USFA is always excited to offer this safe concept to its members. The Pairs style of diving guarantees improvement in the individuals spearfishing and diving skill and ensures safer practice due to the "one up one down" nature of the event, the one diver "up" on the surface is able to look out for his descending team mate's safety both below and on top of the water.

Junior divers are able to enter with a Parent or older diver so not only will it ensure great enjoyment with the family it can also see greater knowledge handed down to the next generation. Throw in great fish prizes and trophies for the teams and everyone can walk away smiling from a great day in the water. The fish sheet for this format also differs to regular club events.

Some helpful points that may answer some questions:

- Great idea to read the rules, then read them again. If you can't be bothered some of the key rules are mentioned below.
- Bring your floats to the event however only one float is used between each team, this float will be marked with your given team number for the weekend keep reading.
- You will need to supply your pair with a 4m line, a requirement for you to have on you. This is one of two lines, the other being more than 6m and less than 40m see Rule 4.6
- Rule 3.6 where one member of the team must hold the long line the other member must hold the short line. So it is a great idea to ensure you have shark clips on your guns (you each carry a gun) and shark clips on your shared float.
- One member of the pair is always on the surface see rule 3.4
- Rule 3.9 A team member may assist their team mate to land a fish. However, one diver must remain on the surface.
- It is imperative to have one diver up on the surface while one diver is down at all times.
- Everyone leaves from the same area it is a rockhopping event no boats.
- When you come back ensure you sign off so we don't go looking for you, and present your fish in an enclosed esky or tub, iced is preferable.
- Sure there will be an award for best teams and some age categories there will also be prizes for different species of fish.

Join us for a weekend in the ocean to practice the latest advancements in safe skindiving and help to preach the safe diving message to others. Spearfish safely – practice one up one down.

USFA "ONE UP ONE DOWN" PAIRS EVENTS

MEET DIRECTOR (MD)

The MD shall be the person responsible for the day to day running of the Competition.

The MD will use all means at his/her disposal to ensure safe and successful competitions.

The MD will make every endeavour to follow the Pairs Events Rules where necessary the USFA competition rules and procedures and Minimum Standards for running a NSW USFA Spearfishing event may be referenced if there is an issue that is not covered by the Pairs Events Rules.

The MD may penalise or disqualify any individual or team who breaks a safety or Meet rule for which there is no provision already listed under these rules.

Any disputes arising under these rules may be referred to the MD.

Where an individual of a team is penalised or disqualified, that penalty shall apply to the team.

In all cases the individual or team may have their results recorded.

The MD may not compete in these events.

PROTESTS AND APPEALS

Any protests or appeals by participants shall be made in writing to the MD.

Any protest must be made within one hour after the completion of the event on that day. Any appeals must be made no later than one hour after the results of the event have been announced.

SPEED LIMITS

No associated boats other than safety boats may manoeuvre in the event area during the event. All boats shall operate at safe speeds and in a safe manner that is in accordance with NSW Roads and Maritime.

STATE FISHERIES AND MARITIME REGULATIONS

Fisheries and Maritime Safety rules and regulations must be observed at all times.

TROPHIES

All perpetual trophies, where they may be issued, are to be retained by the MD.

All additional engravings on medallions and/or purchase of miniatures, if any are awarded, will be the responsibility of the recipient. Any trophy which is damaged or lost must be immediately reported to the MD.

ALTERATION OF RULES

Ongoing tournaments of this sort will see adjustments made as seen fit by MD.

BEHAVIOUR OF MEMBERS

Behaviour of members which in any way brings USFA into disrepute will be first reviewed by the MD. The MD will then refer all matters arising to USFA committee for their consideration.

BRIEFING

A briefing for competitors, regarding rules, weather conditions and any restrictions on events due to inclement weather will be held on Thursday night, 28th September at 7.30pm.

DISPUTES

The SCMB committee reserve the right to adjudicate as is and if necessary in the event of any dispute or breach of rules by a competitor or participating club. The SCMB committee also has the right to excise discretion to suspend or cancel any section of the competition in the interest of competitor's safety due to inclement weather. The decision of the SCMB committee is final. Any protest must be made in writing and handed to the competition SCMB committee by midnight of that particular day except on the last day when they must be handed in by (time) and within at least 30 minutes of the result being declared.

CONDUCT

All competitors are required to observe courtesy and etiquette always to fellow competitors and the general public. The SCMB committee will not hesitate to call upon the services of security or the police if the committee deems it necessary.

SAFETY

All competitors must comply with NSW boating legislation regarding safety equipment, registration and licensing, safe operation and speed limits. Refer NSW RMS Maritime http://www.rms.nsw.gov.au/maritime/index.html . As the competition will include open water, competitors will need to fully acquaint themselves with bar and sea conditions and make their own decisions as to whether to attempt bar crossings and proceed to sea. If the SCMB committee deem weather conditions unsuitable the committee reserves the right to cancel any part of the competition in whole or part, this will be announced via Facebook and on the website. It is up to the competitors to monitor this website to see if venues are open and closed as weather allows.

BOATING SAFETY

All boats must comply with safety requirements as laid down by NSW Maritime. Any boat not complying with these regulations will risk disqualification. The SCMB Committee reserves the right to inspect any boat to ensure compliance. Ensure you have sufficient approved lifejackets for all aboard the boat and everyone on board knows where they are located and how and when to use them. A lifejacket can be the difference between survival and disaster in a boating accident. Anglers are required by law to wear a lifejacket when directed by the master of the vessel, or in the following situations:

Boats less than 4.8m:

- At all times by anyone under the age of 12;
- On open (coastal) waters including when crossing a coastal bar;
- o When boating alone or at night, or on alpine waters, or when being towed.
- Boats 4.8 8.0m:
- When crossing a coastal bar;
- When being towed;
- When wearing waders on alpine waters;
- If under age of 12, when in an open area of a vessel when underway.
- Boats greater than 8.0m:
- When being towed;
- When crossing a coastal bar.
- Canoes and kayaks:
- On enclosed waters more than 100m from shore;
- On open (coastal) waters, including when crossing a coastal bar.

Alcohol and boating don't mix. The blood alcohol limit on the water is the same as on the roads 0.05% - be mindful the combined impact of wind, sun and wave action multiply the effect of alcohol. Your chances of disorientation and drowning are increased - this applies to everyone, the skipper, crew and passengers.

Always check the weather (Weather Info' line 1900 937107) and log your boat on and off with the local Coast Guard or Coastal Patrol base. Keep your radio alert for weather changes or warnings. Do not hesitate to seek assistance if you need it. Do not rely solely on a mobile phone for help as the range of most mobile phones is limited at sea.

Most boating accidents involve recreational craft of less than 6 meters. It is important you know the wind and wave limits of your boat and don't take chances in conditions you might not be able to handle. If you do capsize, stay with the boat and your chances of rescue are improved.

ROCK FISHING SAFETY

Rock Fishing can be dangerous. Competitors fishing the rocks and beach should observe the following basic rules –

Never fish by yourself. Fish in a group of at least 3 people and within sight of each other. Inform others of your plans – always let family or friends know where you are going and when you will be back. If some one is washed in, one person should ideally stay and help while the other alerts emergency services. Dial 000 or 112 on mobile to access emergency services.

Wear the right gear. Light clothing such as shorts and a spray jacket or a wet suit will let you swim more easily if you are washed in. Jumpers can be heavy and difficult to take off in the water. Wear sandals and sandshoes with non-slip soles or with cleats to suit the rock surface. Wear a lifejacket or buoyancy vest and bring something buoyant that can be easily thrown and held onto to help stay afloat. Carry ropes and torches.

Observe first- fish later. Spend some time watching your intended spot to get an idea of the conditions over a full swell/wave cycle. Know the tides as wave conditions can worsen with a rising tide. Plan an escape route in case you are washed in. Stay calm if you are washed in – swim away from the rocks and look for a safe place to come ashore or stay afloat until help comes. Stay alert – never turn your back on the sea. If waves, weather or swell threaten your fishing spot then leave immediately.

Avoid fishing in exposed locations during rough or rising seas. Make sure you are aware of local weather, swell and tidal conditions before going fishing. Call the Weather Infoline on 1900 937107. Be aware that conditions can and do change dramatically and quickly.

The Tomakin Sports & Social Club Fishing Club, ANSA NSW Branch and the USFA will not accept any liability for any injury, loss or damage of any kind. It will be the responsibility of each skipper, crew and entrant whether or not to start or continue the competition. Competitors enter entirely at their own risk.

MEALS AND ALCOHOL

It is a COMPUSORY requirement of law governed by the NSW Office of Liquor, Gamin and Racing that all visitors to the Tomakin Sports and Social club become a FREE, seven day visiting member of the club in order to be served food and alcohol. This can be done on the Thursday evening when attending the competition briefing or whenever you arrive to the event.

Lunch BBQ tickets will be provided when competitors pick up their registration entry tickets at the briefing. Late comers can pick up their BBQ and registration tickets at the events administration marquee throughout the several days of the event. One BBQ ticket per person per day will be provided. No BBQ ticket, No food. Additional BBQ food is available for purchase after BBQ tickets are used.

Full Restaurant facilities are available for your convenience at the Tomakin Sport & Social club. Hours of operation are 10am till late. Breakfast is not available at the event.

PRIZES

ALL prizes will be awarded. There is always a small portion of prizes that are not won each year. It is the policy of the Tomakin Fishing Club and the SCMB committee to award all remaining prizes by random draw to competitors that have not won any prize at the end of the presentation.

COMPLIANCE

All competitors must comply with rules and regulations laid down or in force during the Competition by the host club or by any Government body or authority. Any fish captured during the Competition cannot be sold and must comply with all recreational size and bag limits.

DUMPING OF FISH

The dumping of fish after weighing will not be accepted as a sustainable practice encouraged by the SCMB Committee. Ensure fish that are to be weighed are presented in a "fit for consumption" manner and are utilised as a human food source after weighing.

SPECIAL NOTES FOR ANSA MEMBERS

As per ANSA rule book.

1KG LINE CLASS is NOT eligible in this Convention. Any 1 kg line captures will go under 2 Kg division but can be recorded as 1 Kg Line for your internal club records. All lines, doubles, traces or leaders may be subject to measurement as weighmasters and recorders see fit. All fish must be weighed at the event grounds of the South Coast Mighty Bonanza Fishing Competition.

BRAID/GELSPUN FISHING LINES can be used as per ANSA NSW rules.

This competition is open to all financial members of ANSA (Australian National Sportfishing Association) and counts towards point score for the ACC (ANSA Convention Competition).


